Erzählte Geschichte

Die nach der gleichnamigen Zeitschrift benannte Annales-'Schule' darf als eine der bedeutendsten Etappen in der jüngeren Historiographiegeschichte gelten. Neue Forschungsfelder und -methoden, aber auch neue Erzählweisen zeugen von ihrer Innovationskraft. Die Studie situiert sich im theoretischen Feld der Diskussion um Geschichte und Erzählung, ohne indes der postmodernen Orthodoxie zu folgen. In vier exemplarischen narratologischen Lektüren (Werken von Georges Duby, Jacques Le Goff, Emmanuel Le Roy Ladurie und Natalie Z. Strategies of Persuasion in Herodotus' Histories and Genesis-Kings

Strategies of Persuasion is the first comparative study of narrative means of persuasion in Herodotus' Histories and Genesis–Kings in the Hebrew Bible. Eva Tyrell perceives rhetorical techniques of persuasion as a window into ancient historical thought.

Narrative Factuality

The study of narrative—the object of the rapidly growing discipline of narratology—has been traditionally concerned with the fictional narratives of literature, such as novels or short stories. But narrative is a transdisciplinary and transmedial concept whose manifestations encompass both the fictional and the factual. In this volume, which provides a companion piece to Tobias Klauk and Tilmann Köppe's Fiktionalität: Ein interdisziplinäres Handbuch, the use of narrative to convey true and reliable information is systematically explored across media, cultures and disciplines, as well as in its narratological, stylistic, philosophical, and rhetorical dimensions. At a time when the notion of truth has come under attack, it is imperative to reaffirm the commitment to facts of certain types of narrative, and to examine critically the foundations of this commitment. But because it takes a background for a figure to emerge clearly, this book will also explore nonfactual types of narratives, thereby providing insights into the nature of narrative fiction that could not be reached from the narrowly literary perspective of early narratology.

William L. Shirers Werk über NS-Deutschland

Dies ist die erste Untersuchung des Werks des NS-Chronisten und Zeitzeugen William L. Shirer (1904-93) an der Schnittstelle von Literatur-, Geschichtswissenschaft und Amerikanistik. Die Auswertung seines bislang unveröffentlichten Nachlasses entlarvt sein millionenfach verkauftes, vermeintlich authentisches Berlin Diary (1941) als hochgradig literarisiert und bearbeitet - teils fingiert. Neben werkgenetischen Einblicken werden anhand von Werkplänen und Korrespondenz der Konstruktionscharakter und die Methoden zur Authentizitätserzeugung deutlich, die die Rezeption des Berlin Diary jahrzehntelang gelenkt haben. Die Studie umfasst Shirers narrative Strategien innerhalb seines Gesamtwerks, darunter die in Deutschland unbekannten Romane der 1950er Jahre, zeitdiagnostische Bücher, die Geschichtswerke der 60er Jahre (z.B. Rise and Fall of the Third Reich) und seine Autobiographie. Sichtbar wird ein zeitlebens auf den US-Buchmarkt zielendes Recycling seiner Zeitzeugenschaft in NS-Deutschland.

Fiktionales Erzählen

Die Beiträge dieses Bandes gehen auf eine internationale Tagung zurück, die 2017 in Manchester stattgefunden hat. Sie untersuchen die Darstellung von Geschichte in der mittelalterlichen deutschen Literatur auf der Basis von aktuellen erzähltheoretischen Forschungsansätzen. Dabei wird ein breites Spektrum an Texten, Gattungen und Diskursen in den Blick genommen; als Angelpunkt für zahlreiche relevante Fragestellungen erweist sich die im 12. Jahrhundert entstandene Kaiserchronik Geleitet von der Erkenntnis, dass Vergangenheit erst im Erzählen zu Geschichte wird, analysieren die Beiträge einschlägige narrative Strategien.

Geschichte erzählen. Strategien der Narrativierung von Vergangenheit im Mittelalter

Die narrative Struktur eines Textes beeinflusst maßgeblich die Art, wie die in ihm erzählte Geschichte von dem Leser wahrgenommen wird. Je nachdem, wie sich die Geschichte und die erzählerische Gestaltung zueinander verhalten, können sich unterschiedliche Eindrücke wie inhaltliche Derbheit oder Erhabenheit entfalten und die Textinterpretation determinieren. Bislang wurden insbesondere die Erzählstrukturen großepischer Werke von der mediolatinistischen Forschung erfasst. Inwiefern Kleinepen einen anderen narrativen Ductus aufweisen und somit die Werkdimension die Faktur der Narration bestimmt, blieb wenig beachtet. Die vorliegende Arbeit setzt bei dieser offenen Frage an und bietet anhand narratologischer Untersuchungen fünf frühmittelalterlicher Kleinepen – "Waltharius", "Ruodlieb", "Karlsepos", "Ecbasis captivi" und "Vita Mammae" – eine textzentrierte Antwort. Mittels umfangreicher Erzähleranalysen dieser verschiedenen Gestaltungsmöglichkeiten narrativer Kompositionen und deren Kontrastierung mit großepischen Erzählweisen skizziert die Arbeit ein Profil kleinformatigen Erzählens, das sich stärker an diskursiven als an inhaltlichen Parametern orientiert. The narrative structure of a text significantly influences the way in which the reader perceives the story being told. Depending on the interaction of the story and the narrative structure, different impressions such as coarseness or sublimity can be created and determine how the text is interpreted. The narrative structure of major epic works has been examined by scholars of mediaeval Latin in the past. Less attention has been given to the way that epyllia display a different narrative ductus and the dimension of the text shapes the texture of the narration. This study begins with this open question and offers a text-centred answer based on a narratological examination of five early mediaeval epyllia – Waltharius, Ruodlieb, the Karlsepos, the Ecbasis captivi and the Vita Mammae. Through

comprehensive analyses of the various possible means of shaping these narrative compositions and of the contrasts with narrative models in major epics, the work creates a profile of small-format narration oriented more strongly towards discursive than content-focused parameters.

Narration und Gattung

This volume of essays is the result of the EU project -EHISTO-, which dealt with the mediation of history in popular history magazines and explored how history in the commercialised mass media can be used in history teaching in order to develop the media literacy and the transcultural competences of young people. The volume offers articles which for the first time address the phenomenon of popular history magazines in Europe and their mediating strategies in a foundational way. The articles are intended as introductory material for teachers and student teachers. The topic also offers an innovative approach in terms of making possible a European cross-country comparison, in which results based on qualitative and quantitative methods are presented, related to the content focus areas profiled in the national magazines."

Commercialised History: Popular History Magazines in Europe

Beards and Texts explores the literary portrayal of beards in medieval German texts from the mid-twelfth to the early sixteenth centuries. It argues that as the pre-eminent symbol for masculinity the beard played a distinctive role throughout the Middle Ages in literary discussions of such major themes as majesty and humanity. At the same time beards served as an important point of reference in didactic poetry concerned with wisdom, teaching and learning, and in comedic texts that were designed to make their audiences laugh, not least by submitting various figure-types to the indignity of having their beards manhandled. Four main chapters each offer a reading of a work or poetic tradition of particular significance (Pfaffe Konrad's Rolandslied; Wolfram von Eschenbach's Willehalm; 'Sangspruchdichtung'; Heinrich Wittenwiler's Ring), before examining cognate material of various kinds, including sources or later versions of the same story, manuscript variants and miniatures and further relevant beard-motifs from the same period. The book concludes by reviewing the portrayal of Jesus in vernacular German literature, which represents a special test-case in the literary history of beards. As the first study of its kind in medieval German studies, this investigation submits beard-motifs to sustained and detailed analysis in order to shed light both on medieval poetic techniques and the normative construction of masculinity in a wide range of literary genres.

Geschichte als narrative Kostruktion

In this Open Access book, film scholar Rasmus Greiner develops a theoretical model for the concept of the histosphere to refer to the "sphere" of a cinematically modelled, physically experienceable historical world. His analysis of practices of modelling and perceiving, immersion and empathy, experience and remembering, appropriation and refiguration, combine approaches from film studies, such as Vivian Sobchack's phenomenology of film experience, with historiographic theories, such as Frank R. Ankersmit's concept of historical experience. Building on this analysis, Greiner examines the spatial and temporal organization of historical films and presents discussions of mood and atmosphere, body and memory, and genre and historical consciousness. The analysis is based around three historical films, spanning six decades, that depict 1950s Germany: Helmut Käutner's Sky Without Stars (1955), Jutta Brückner's Years of Hunger (1980), and Sven Bohse's three-part TV series Ku'damm 56 (2016).

Beards and Texts

Water is a global resource for modern societies - and water was a global resource for pre-modern societies. The many different water systems serving processes of urbanisation and urban life in ancient times and the Middle Ages have hardly been researched until now. The numerous contributions to this volume pose questions such as what the basic cultural significance of water was, the power of water, in the town and for the town, from different points of view. Symbolic, aesthetic, and cult aspects are taken up, as is the role of water in politics, society, and economy, in daily life, but also in processes of urban planning or in urban neighbourhoods. Not least, the dangers of polluted water or of flooding presented a challenge to urban society. The contributions in this volume draw attention to the complex, manifold relations between water and human beings. This collection presents the results of an international conference in Kiel in 2018. It is directed towards both scholars in ancient and mediaeval studies and all those interested in the diversity of water systems in urban space in ancient and mediaeval times.

Cinematic Histospheres

History and Film: A Tale of Two Disciplines addresses the representation of history in cinema, a much-argued debate on the need to understand cinematic history in its own terms and develop a certain vocabulary for discussing historical films, their relation to public history, and their impact on public historical consciousness. Eleftheria Thanouli does this by changing the agenda altogether - combining a macro-level perspective with a micro-level one in order to argue that cinematic history is the dominant form of historiography in the 20th century, as it succeeded in remediating and repurposing the key formal, rhetorical, and ideological practices of 19th-century professional historiography. With case studies ranging from The Thin Red Line and Life is Beautiful, to The Fog of War and The Last Bolshevik, Thanouli bridges the gap between history and film studies and lays the foundations for a new visual historiography.

The Power of Urban Water

Physics and Literature is a unique collaboration between physicists, literary scholars, and philosophers, the first collection of essays to examine together how science and literature, beneath their practical differences, share core dimensions – forms of questioning, thinking, discovering and communicating insights. This book advances an in-depth exploration of relations between physics and literature from both perspectives. It turns around the tendency to discuss relations between literature and science in one-sided and polarizing ways. The collection is the result of the inaugural conference of ELINAS, the Erlangen Center for Literature and Natural Science, an initiative dedicated to building bridges between literary and scientific research. ELINAS revitalizes discussion of science-literature interconnections with new topics, ideas and angles, by organizing genuine dialogue among participants across disciplinary lines. The essays explore how scientific thought and practices are conditioned by narrative and genre, fiction, models and metaphors, and how science in turn feeds into the meaning-making of literary and philosophical texts. These interdisciplinary encounters enrich reflections on epistemology, cognition and aesthetics.

History and Film

Physics and Literature

Narratology and Interpretation
