Since it was first published in 1989, Men of the Battle of Britain has become a standard reference book for academics and researchers interested in the Battle of Britain. Copies are also owned by many with purely an armchair interest in the events of 1940. The book records the service details of the airmen who took part in the Battle of Britain in considerable detail. Where known, postings and their dates are included, as well as promotions, decorations and successes claimed flying against the enemy. There is also much personal detail, often including dates and places of birth, civilian occupations, dates of death and place of burial or, for those with no known grave, place of commemoration. There are many wartime head-and-shoulders photographs. Inevitably the high achievers who survived tend to have the longest entries, but those who were killed very quickly, sometimes even on their first sortie, are given equal status. The 2015 third edition will include new names and corrected spellings, as well as many new photographs. Plenty of the entries have been extended with freshly acquired information. The stated nationalities of some of the airmen have been re-examined and, for example, one man always considered to be Australian is now known to have been Irish.

Left Shift

On 1st September 1993, Georgina Robinson, an occupational therapist working at the Edith Morgan Centre, was fatally wounded by a paranoid schizophrenic, Andrew Robinson, a patient detained under the Mental Health Act 1983. Andrew Robinson had been suffering from mental illness since 1978, when he was committed to Broadmoor Special Hospital on his conviction for possession of a firearm with intent to endanger a life. He is now back in Broadmoor, following his conviction in March 1994 for manslaughter on the grounds of diminished responsibility.

The Just Men Of Cordova

Cartoonist and doctor Ian Williams introduces us to the troubled life of Dr Iwan James, as all humanity, it seems, passes through his surgery door. Cultural Psychiatry

Cultural psychiatry has been the portal through which advances in the social sciences have found their way into medical practice and health policy. Diverse issues and activities in research and practice of cultural and transcultural psychiatry are collected in this timely volume. It is that criminals may take advantage of the plea of insanity to secure acquittal or commitment to a hospital instead of to a prison. The necessity, therefore, of protecting the prisoner on one hand and of protecting society on the other has introduced marked changes in modern law and methods of practice in the courts of civi lized countries. We are obliged to ask to-day whether the prisoner was sane when the act with which he is charged was committed. At least we are obliged to meet this question whenever it is raised. He may have been sane when the act was committed and be insane at the time of his trial, or he may have been insane when the act was committed though sane at the time of trial, or he may become insane after he is convicted and sentenced and while serving his term in prison. The irresponsibility of the prisoner thus creates a new responsibility for society. It is the responsibility, first, of determining whether an accused person is or was mentally diseased, and then of deciding what form of treatment the person shall receive. It may be acquittal if his recovery and harmlessness are beyond doubt, or it may be committal to a hospital or to a Special asylum for the criminal insane. "The United States Code is the official codification of the general and permanent laws of the United States of America. The Code was first published in 1926, and a new edition of the code has been

published every six years since 1934. The 2012 edition of the Code incorporates laws enacted through the One Hundred Twelfth Congress. Second Session, the last of which was signed by the President on January 15, 2013. It does not include laws of the One Hundred Thirteenth Congress, First Session, enacted between January 2, 2013, the date it convened, and January 15, 2013.
