The true nature of art was not philosophically grasped, and the profound relation of the plays to life was but dimly hinted at. Meanwhile, the Queen (Imogen's stepmother) plots against her stepdaughter by trying to plan a match between Imogen and her worthless son Cloten. *Life of William Shakespeare* is a biography of William Shakespeare by the eminent critic Sidney Lee. His article on Shakespeare in the fifty-first volume of the Dictionary of National Biography formed the basis of his *Life of William Shakespeare*. This full-length life is often credited as the first modern biography of the poet.
