Few philosophers have been as widely misunderstood as Nietzsche. His detractors and followers alike have often fundamentally misinterpreted him, distorting his views and intentions and criticizing or celebrating him for reasons removed from the views he actually held. Now Nietzsche assesses his place in European thought, concentrating upon his writings in the last decade of his productive life.

The preface accuses philosophers of dogmatism, and the first chapter explores this claim. Every great philosophy, Nietzsche asserts, is little more than the personal confession. Philosophers build up complex systems of thought to justify their own assumptions and prejudices. If we can dig these out, we can see what these philosophers value most deeply, and so gain insight into their character. Nietzsche contrasts their dogmatism with the "free spirit" that is not caught up in a particular point of view. He

hopes the philosophers of the future will be characterized by such an experimental method, willing to try out any hypothesis, and follow any argument all the way to its conclusion.

The bold genius of Friedrich Nietzsche, the controversial and legendary philosopher whose thought has impacted modern man like no other--shines through here in this classic literary meditation on the failings of past thinkers and intellectuals, men who divided the so-named "good" from what they took to be "evil." Nietzsche offers here a penetrating reexamination of human values, maintaining that what is taken to be "evil" may, in point of fact, be the animalistic virtue of a sentient being imbued with an indomitable "Will to Power," while altruistic values, conversely, are the mark of weak, lowly, or degenerating creatures. "He who fights with monsters should be careful lest he thereby become a monster. And if thou gaze long into an abyss, the abyss will also gaze into thee." Expanding on his ideas from Thus Spoke Zarathustra, Nietzsche's radical polemic Beyond Good and Evil undermines the assumptions of traditional morality and encourages us to think more critically about the world in which we live. In this famous text, Nietzsche considers past philosophers and religious leaders from Socrates to Descartes to Schopenhauer with a critical and pessimistic eye. Questioning the blind following of religious faith, he examines the deeper question of who is truly good or evil. Beyond Good and Evil presents a unique perspective of the human mind offered through the words of one of history's most controversial philosophers.

Beyond Good and Evil (illustrated)

Beyond Good and Evil by philosopher Friedrich Nietzsche discusses the theory of the "will to truth." At the heart of Nietzsche's argument is the idea that to learn the truth, a human being must question everything. Everything she or he has ever learned or observed must be reexamined. Nothing is free from this self-interrogation, and that includes self-perception, societal teachings, and religion. Nietzsche proposes that any human being has the capability to do this, but most do not because they lack the ambition to dig through everything they have ever learned to guestion its validity. Nietzsche does not value those who have not the desire to delve into the deepest areas of their mind to find the truth. So where does Nietzsche get his truth from? He writes that his theories are a result of the intensity of his education, particularly the study of Ancient Greek and modern philosophers. However, he thinks little of newer philosophers. While he believes they may raise unique and interesting points, he believes them to be untried and untested. Two of Nietzsche's main viewpoints rise to the surface in Beyond Good and Evil. The first topic that is near and dear to him is that of intelligence. He makes the effort to highlight the foolishness of humans throughout history. He insists that a person's upbringing is no excuse for not pursuing or using intelligence. The second topic which heavily permeates this book is Nietzsche's opinion of women. His opinion is not generous, as he believes that females are incompetent and should simply be guiet and do as men tell them to do. He does not believe women have the mental capacity to grasp knowledge, therefore, they must rely solely on instinct. Though Nietzsche points out that morality and immorality are polar opposites, he paradoxically insists that nothing can be split into black and white--there exist only shades of gray. This argument, in particular, forms the foundation for his discussion of religion. He proposes that faith requires one to sacrifice one's truth. This is where he says that there are only shades of gray between the faithful and the atheist. In Beyond Good and Evil, blind faith is the enemy of the will to truth. He also discusses what he believes is the importance of tempo in language. He suggests that a misunderstanding of tempo leads to inaccuracies in translation. In fact, the translation of Beyond Good and Evil into English has some inaccuracies, but whether or not they are due to tempo is not clear. Nietzsche believes that if this were not an issue, then other cultures would have a better understanding of both ancient and modern philosophies. Getting further into Nietzsche's ideals of intelligence, he believes that anyone who is unwilling to cast off the traditions of their faith, what they have learned from parents and society, and what they think they know to be true in order to discover their real truth, is stupid or doltish. He has no time for these individuals and

even discusses how he abandons friendships if he discovers the other party to possess this doltish quality. He also thinks that anyone who is not of German heritage is subject to this classification, since he believes that only the German language provides an understanding of philosophical truth. Friedrich Nietzsche was not only a philosopher, but also a poet, cultural critic, and philologist. When he was twenty-four years old, he became the youngest-ever Chair of Classical Philology at the University of Basel. This happened in 1869, and he took great pride in his position, in teaching, and in continuing his own studies. Ten years later, he was forced to resign due to illness, and he died eleven years after that, in 1900. He was prone to illness since his youth, and suffered severe migraines, near blindness, and violent indigestion issues. In 1889, he experienced a mental breakdown after reportedly trying to save a horse from being flogged...

Then, turning to the implications of the new ontology for morality and politics, Nietzsche argues that these can be reconstituted on the fundamental insights of the new philosophy. Nietzsche's comprehensive depiction of this anti-Platonic philosophy ends with a chapter on nobility, in which he contends that what can now be publicly celebrated as noble in our species are its highest achievements of mind and spirit.

After a discussion about the religious spirit, which according to him is a kind of dogmatism, Nietzsche embarks on a series of

epigrams, most of which highlight our strange psychological makeup. Next, consider the long history of moral systems as a set of different attempts at self-improvement. He speaks out strongly against the "herd" morality that fosters boring mediocrity in everyone. Deep down, however, everyone is prejudiced. To prove this point, Nietzsche launches an eight-page tirade against women. He then addresses the question of nationalities and nationalism, relying on a kind of Lamarckism that considers that different nationalities or "races" inherently have certain characteristics. Among other things, Nietzsche attacks anti-Semitism, criticizes the English, and advances the concept of the "good European\

Nietzsche claimed to be a philosopher of the future, but he was appropriated as a philosopher of Nazism. His work inspired a long study by Martin Heidegger and essays by a host of lesser disciples attached to the Third Reich. In 1935, however, Karl Jaspers set out to "marshall against the National Socialists the world of thought of the man they had proclaimed as their own philosopher." The year after Nietzsche was published, Jaspers was discharged from his professorship at Heidelberg University by order of the Nazi leadership. Unlike the ideologues, Jaspers does not selectively cite Nietzsche's work to reinforce already held opinions. Instead, he presents Nietzsche as a complex, wide-ranging philosopher - extraordinary not only because he foresaw all the monstrosities of the twentieth century but also because he saw through them.
