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Emily Brontë's Novel Wuthering Heights in Comparison with a Film Adaptation

Seminar paper from the year 2004 in the subject English Language and Literature Studies - Literature, grade: 1,0, Technical University of Braunschweig, 10 entries in the bibliography, language: English, abstract: Emily Brontë's novel Wuthering Heights is one of the "greatest works of art" (Kettle 1974, 130) and also "one of the 19th century's most evocative novels" (Tibbetts/Welsh 1998, 469). Emily Brontë is perhaps the greatest writer of the three Brontë sisters. She published only one novel, Wuthering Heights (1847), a story of doomed love and revenge. But that single work has its place among the masterpieces of English literature. After its release, a lot of reviewers were shocked, mystified and puzzled, though some also expressed admiration for the strange power of the novel. Wilson, Schlueter and Schlueter (1997, 63) point out that "even modern critics have difficulty dealing with the novel, tending either toward a stress on its eccentricity or concentration on very small sections." A lot of books and articles have been written about Emily Brontë's only novel - and there are also a couple of films dealing with the story or with parts of the story. In my study I will concentrate on the question if there are differences between Emily Brontë's novel and the film adaptation by William Wyler (published in 1939). Therefore I am going to describe the most important diversities in detail and give possible reasons for the changes. But before starting with this I would first like to introduce Emily Brontë's biography and a summary of her famous novel Wuthering Heights.

Wuthering Heights, written between October 1845 and June 1846, by Emily Brontë is one of the main classic novels of English literature, together with Sense and Sensibility (Author Jane Austin) and Great Expectations (Author Charles Dickens), which were successfully transformed into films by British filmmakers. Cinematic adaptations often provoke debates about their fidelity, to the original; discussions about how the classic text has been transformed into film, whether adapted movies are spoiling the charm of the novel and thus ruining it, or, on the contrary, whether film has "rescued" the novel, making it seem more interesting and worth reading in a new historical context. Can a novel be successfully transformed into film without spoiling it? Or on the contrary we may consider novels cannot be replaced and by adapting them the films deprive spectators of their ability to imagine?

Wuthering Heights

Emily Brontë's *Wuthering Heights* is a 1992 feature film adaptation of Emily Brontë's novel *Wuthering Heights* directed by Peter Kosminsky. *Emily Brontë's Wuthering Heights*, released in 1992, is based on the 1847 book by Emily Brontë which was written a year before her death. This particular film is notable for including the oft-omitted second generation story of the children of Cathy, Hindley and Heathcliff.

New to "Backgrounds and Contexts" are additional letters, a compositional chronology, related prose, and reviews of the 1847 text. "Criticism" collects five important assessments of *Wuthering Heights*, three of them new to the Fourth Edition, including Lin Haire-Sargeant's essay on film adaptations of the novel. *Wuthering Heights* is a wild, passionate story of the intense and almost demonic love between Catherine Earnshaw and Heathcliff, a foundling adopted by Catherine's father. After Mr Earnshaw's death, Heathcliff is bullied and humiliated by Catherine's brother Hindley and wrongly believing that his love for Catherine is not reciprocated, leaves *Wuthering Heights*, only to return years later as a wealthy and polished man. He proceeds to exact a terrible revenge for his former miseries.
