Bindung

Die Beiträge dieses Bandes führen die teilweise auf unterschiedlichen Wegen entstandenen Erkenntnisse der beiden Richtungen zusammen. Eines wissen wir ganz sicher: Eine sichere Bindungserfahrung in der Kindheit - wenigstens eine! - ist ein ganz wichtiger Schutz gegen das Aufkommen psychopathologischer Symptome nach einem traumatischen Erlebnis. Die Erkenntnisse der Bindungsforschung haben in jüngerer Zeit in psychoanalytische und psychotherapeutische Überlegungen Einzug gehalten. Dieses Buch führt nun erstmals die bisher weitgehend unabhängig voneinander operierenden Richtungen Bindungsforschung und Psychotraumatologie zusammen. Es wird dargestellt, wie Bindungsverhalten und -störungen mit traumatischen Trennungs- und Verlusterlebnissen zusammenhängen oder auch mit anderen traumatischen Ereignissen wie körperlicher und emotionaler Mißhandlung oder sexueller Gewalt. Bindung, Psychopathologie und Delinquenz. Definitionen, Bezüge und Perspektiven für die therapeutische Praxis

Die heute weltweit führenden Bindungsforscher aus den USA, aus England und aus Deutschland berichten in aktuellen Beiträgen über den derzeitigen »State of the Art« ihres Faches. Das Thema Bindungen und Bindungsstörungen findet gerade in jüngerer Zeit ein zunehmendes Interesse. Diese in den 60er Jahren entstandene Forschungsrichtung hat viele Forscher inspiriert und in Untersuchungen zu fruchtbaren Ergebnissen geführt. Die Bindungstheorie verfügt mittlerweile über wertvolle Erkenntnisse aus Langzeituntersuchungen und langfristigen Projekten zur Vorbeugung seelischer Erkrankungen in Risikogruppen, so daß heutige Bindungsforscher viel genauere Antworten geben können als noch vor wenigen Jahren, zum Beispiel über die Ursachen von Gewalttätigkeit, Kindesmißbrauch oder über Scheidungsfolgen. Eine weitere Erklärung für den Erfolg der Bindungstheorie besteht darin, daß Psychotherapeuten aus ganz unterschiedlichen Richtungen, Psychologen, Psychoanalytiker und Mitarbeiter aus sozialen Berufsfeldern die Erkenntnisse der Bindungsforschung in ihre Theorie integrieren können und daß sie vor allem in ihrer täglichen Arbeit davon profitieren können.

Selbstreflexivität, Bindung und Psychopathologie

Nachdem die von John Bowlby in den 1950er Jahren entwickelte Bindungstheorie zunächst nur im Bereich der Kinderpsychologie Beachtung fand, setzte vor etwa einem Jahrzehnt eine Welle der Wiederentdeckung ein, in der die Bedeutung dieser Theorie für das Verständnis auch des erwachsenen Menschen und seiner seelischen Störungen bewusst wurde. Neu ist der Versuch, die Erkenntnisse der Bindungsforschung auch für die Psychiatrie nutzbar zu machen. Wenn die frühen Bindungserfahrungen eines Menschen spätere psychische Erkrankungen beeinflussen oder gar hervorrufen können, sollte dies auch bei psychiatrischen Patienten berücksichtigt werden. Das Buch macht mit den Grundlagen der Bindungsforschung und -theorie vertraut und befasst sich mit den Konsequenzen für die Behandlung in der Psychiatrie.

Bindungstheorie in der Psychiatrie

Die vorliegende Monographie ist das Ergebnis einer fünf jährigen klinischen Forschungsarbeit. Das große, auf über tausend Einzelsitzungen angewachsene Material konnte allein deshalb gewonnen werden, weil die psychotoxischen Versuche überwiegend im Dienst einer Therapie standen. Ihre Anfänge reichen in meine Assistentenzeit an der Universitäts-Nervenlinik Marburg im Jahr 1956 zurück. Meinem damaligen Chef, Herrn Prof. Villinger, und Herrn Prof. Stutte schulde ich besonderen Dank für die Förderung der unter den räumlich beengten Verhältnissen der Klinik und ihren Abhängigkeiten durchgeführten Versuche. Sie konnten mit Unterstützung von Herrn Prof. Conradt an der Göttinger Klinik in breiterem Rahmen fortgesetzt werden. Die Empirie der steuerbaren Psychose beim Gesunden forderte besondere psychopathologische Betrachtungsweisen. Die daseinsanalytische Forschungsrichtung, für die ich nicht zuständig bin, wurde dabei ausgeklammert. Vielmehr war es mein Anliegen, die experimentelle Psychose im Rückgriff auf eine heute mehr in den Hintergrund getretene Tradition wieder psychologisch zu untersuchen. Dabei habe ich mich bemüht, gewisse allgemeingültige und nachprüfbare Gesetzmäßigkeiten, zumindest für die toxische Psychose, herauszuarbeiten. Die notwendig anzustellenden methodischen kritischen Erörterungen entwickelten sich aus Diskussionen mit dem Philosophen Dr. J. Finkeldei, dem ich für seine Anregungen und die Durchsicht des Abschnittes "Methodischer Ansatz" herzlich danke. Das Gebiet der experimentellen Psychose hat sich in den letzten Jahren, besonders im Ausland, in stürmischer Entwicklung ausgeweitet und kann nur noch schwer in allen seinen Teilen überblickt werden. Die ältere und jüngere Weltliteratur habe ich so weit berücksichtigt, als sie einer umfassenden psychopathologischen Untersuchung mit Zentrierung auf die Person dient.

Sichere Bindung – Basis fürs Leben

This book examines the scientific contribution and increasing relevance of the Person-Centered Approach (PCA) in psychotherapy. The direction taken in the book is to provide readers with a multidisciplinary and multi-perspective view as well as practical applications. Treating Attachment Disorders

Studienarbeit aus dem Jahr 2012 im Fachbereich Psychologie - Entwicklungspsychologie, Note: 6.0, Universität Bern, Veranstaltung: Entwicklungspsychopathologie, Sprache: Deutsch, Abstract: In der vorliegenden Arbeit wurde der Frage nach einer möglichen Verknüpfung der Bindungstheorie und der diagnostischen Kriterien einer Bindungsstörung nachgegangen. Dabei wurde untersucht, ob sich ein distinkter Einfluss der Bindungsqualität auf die Entstehung und Aufrechterhaltung der Subtypen der Bindungsstörung aufzeigen lässt und inwiefern der Bindungstheorie in der Erklärung der Bindungsstörung Grenzen gesetzt sind. Die Bindungsstörung („reactive attachment disorder“ nach DSM-IV) betrifft eine relativ neue Diagnose mit bisher nur vage formulierten Kriterien. In vielen empirischen Arbeiten wird implizit davon ausgegangen, dass sich die Ätiologie der Bindungsstörung hauptsächlich aus der Bindungstheorie ableiten lässt. Letztendlich bleibt jedoch unklar, wo die Berührungspunkte der beiden Konzepte bestehen, wo sie sich ergänzen und wo sie klar abgegrenzt werden müssen.

Die Experimentelle Psychose

Wenn im Leben eines Erwachsenen nicht alles rund läuft, wird häufig die „schwere Kindheit“ bemüht. Aber längst nicht alle Kinder, die unter widrigen Umständen aufwachsen, entwickeln sich zu psychisch labilen Erwachsenen. Und dennoch kann eine verletzte und traumatisierte Seele zurückbleiben. Nachfolgend wird die Störung des Sozialverhaltens im Detail beleuchtet, um einen besseren Einblick in die Problematik zu gewährleisten. Die Ausprägung und Auswirkung von metakognitiven Fähigkeiten (von Mentalisierungskompetenz) wird im darauffolgenden Unterkapitel thematisiert. Mögliche Dysfunktionalitäten, neurobiologische Veränderungen oder Störungen werden anschließend aufgearbeitet, ehe verschiedene Einflüsse und deren Auswirkungen auf die Entwicklung und das Delinquenzverhalten im vierten Unterkapitel zusammenfließen und durch zusammenfassende Erkenntnisse abgerundet werden. Abschließend werden im sechsten Kapitel schlussfolgernd aus den Erkenntnissen Perspektiven abgeleitet, wie therapeutische Kontakte z.B. von klinisch-therapeutischen SozialarbeiterInnen gestaltet und das Wissen genutzt werden kann.

Affect Regulation, Mentalization, and the Development of the Self

If surgery is indicated, PMS alone is treated with a simple, minimal risk, 20 minute out-patient procedure which usually requires only a few days for recovery. In contrast, surgical treatment for TOS is an operation usually requiring 2-3 days of hospitalization and a few weeks to recover.
